Reservation Details

The 200 acre Mount Major Forest was protected beginning in 2015 to secure key parcels and safeguard public access to popular hiking trails. The stunning summit views at elevation of 1786' include adjacent Quarry Mountain and peaks in he Belknap Range and the Ossipee Range across Lake Winnipesaukee.

Did you know? Mt Major appears on one of the earliest survey maps and is named for its prominence as seen from the lake.

The Belknap Range contains 12 peaks, unique geology, rare plant communities and wildlife habitats across 31,000 acres or 48.5 square miles with more than 70 miles of recreational trails. Prominent peaks include Gunstock and Belknap Mountain. A conservative estimate is that Mt Major receives 80,000 annual hikers.

"Leave No Trace" guidelines are critical to protect the hiking experience for all.

Trail Information

The blue-blazed "Main Trail" ascends from the right rear of the trailhead parking area and climbs to a flat section of the Ames Farm Road and bears left uphill gradually and then steeply over open ledges for 1.5 miles to the stone ruins at the summit, The yellow-blazed "Brook Trail" offers a less steep descent alternative to avoid the ledges.

- DIFFICULTY: Strenuous hike.
- ROUND TRIP DISTANCE: Approximately 3.0 miles round trip (out & back)
- ☼ TRAIL MARKINGS: Blue rectangles Main Trail; yellow rectangles Brook Trail

Getting There/Directions

The often-busy parking lot for Mount Major is located on the west side of Rt. 11 in Alton, about 4 miles north of the southern end of Alton Bay. Additional one-side only parking along the highway is allowed. Plan your visit to arrive early or avoid peak weekend crowds in summer and fall foliage seasons.

- On not disturb plants, animals or cultural features

COVID-19 HIKE SAFE TIPS

- Allow 6+ feet of distance between unrelated groups. Step off the trail to allow others to pass.

- Don't attempt anything risky or outside your comfort zone.
