Reservation Details

Buxton-Simon Forest is a 227-acre reservation in Weare, NH that is a combination of two jointly managed properties. The most significant feature of this forest, which is predominantly white pine, hemlock, red maple and red oak, is the 1,201' Mount Wallingford. The views from near the summit on a clear day are spectacular, and the wildlife viewing throughout the property is splendid on any day of the year.

Trail Information

A yellow-blazed trail leads from the property entrance on Flanders Memorial Road to the top of Mount Wallingford. This moderately strenuous route follows old woods roads (now a snowmobile trail) and narrow hiking paths, and passes through a beautiful wetland area. Steeper sections lead to the summit.

& DIFFICULTY: Moderately strenuous

ROUND TRIP DISTANCE: 3.0 miles

Getting There/Directions

The parking area for Buxton-Simons Forest and Mount Wallingford Trail is located on Flanders Memorial Road in Weare, NH, about 1.3 miles west of the junction of NH Route 114 and NH Route 77. There is a property sign and gate at this location, with enough room for three or four cars to park.
