### **Reservation Details**

Creek Farm is a coastal forest hideaway and beautiful waterfront property just a short drive from the center of Portsmouth. Once part of the 18th-century farm of royal Governor Benning Wentworth, this property borders the shoreline of tidal Sagamore Creek. Creek Farm's tidal mud flats and fragments of rare high salt marsh at the mouth a Sagamore Creek attract migrant shorebirds including gulls, terns, sandpipers, cormorants, and wading egrets and herons.

## **Trail Information**

The Little Harbor Loop Trail (LHLT) begins at the parking area located by the Creek Farm Carriage House. From there, walk across the lawn to the water's edge and bear left to pass in front of the historic "Carey Cottage" and pick up the yellow-blazed LHLT. Pay attention to signage as you go- the LHLT enters and crosses property owned by the City of Portsmouth as well as the State's Wentworth-Coolidge Historic Site before wrapping back around and up the Creek Farm drive. Beautiful forests and tidal creek views abound!

# Getting There/Directions

The parking area and trailhead for Creek Farm are located at 400 Little Harbor Road in Portsmouth. Look for the "Creek Farm Reservation" property sign with Forest Society logo on it at the entrance, and follow the long driveway up to the parking area and kiosk.
