# 95 ACRES, DURHAM, NH

# **Reservation Details**

The 95 acre Dame Forest was protected in the mid 1990s by the Great Bay Regional Protection Partnership (GBRPP), in which the Forest Society is a partner. The property was a priority for protection because of its excellent wildlife habitat, connections to other conserved lands, and its frontage on Crommet Creek.

**Did you know?** This land was once a cattle farm owned by the Dame Family, but the farm was abandoned in the 1950s and reverted to the forest we see today. Beaver have since moved in and changed the landscape dramatically, creating pond and marsh habitat for many wildlife species.

## **Trail Information**

The Sweet Trail runs for 4 miles from Durham all the way to Great Bay, but here we are describing the northern-most section that travels through the Dame Forest, from Longmarsh Road to Dame Road in Durham. Follow the extension of Longmarsh Rd from the parking area and make a right onto the Sweet Trail near the swamp overlook. The trail passes by other marshy areas and hemlock forest until reaching Dame Road. Turn around here and retrace your steps.

- **DIFFICULTY:** Easy
- ROUND TRIP DISTANCE: Approximately 1.8 miles round trip (out & back)
- TRAIL MARKINGS: metal "Sweet Trail" markers

# Getting There/Directions

The best parking area to access the Dame Forest is at the end of Longmarsh Road in Durham. From the center of Durham, travel south on Route 108 for 1.4 miles and take a left onto Longmarsh Road. The small parking area and kiosk maintained by the Town of Durham is at the end, in 1.2 miles.

- Q Google Maps: Entering "Longmarsh Preserve, Durham, NH" will get you directions from your location to this parking area and trailhead for the Sweet Trail.

- No camping or campfires
- Do not disturb plants, animals or cultural features
- Dogs must be under owner control at all times, and all dog waste packed out.
