

■ Heron Rookery Springtime Birding Friday, May 26, 2017 8:30 am to 10:30 am

Join us for a walk to a Great Blue Heron rookery on conservation land owned and managed by Meadowsend Timberlands in Hopkinton. The program will include a stroll on woodland roads and a short bushwhack to the hidden rookery.




■ Lee Town Forest Exploration Saturday, August 5, 2017 9 am to 12 pm

Lee Town Forest boasts a bit of everything: woods, ponds, bogs, and shrubland. Come along with Forest Society staff and members of the Lee Conservation Commission to see some of the unique habitat and wildlife features first-hand while we explore the great network of trails on the property.

■ Farm Tour along the Merrimack Saturday, August 26, 2017 9 am to 12 pm

Meet us for a tour of the innovative and scenic Brookford Farm located along the Merrimack River in Canterbury. Brookford Farm is a 580-acre farm that produces organic vegetables, dairy products, eggs, and meat. 
