Reservation Details

High Five is a 54 -acre reservation in Deering, NH that was purchased with donated funds in 2004. This property offers the opportunity to see a great view (thanks to a timber harvest in 2007) that is just a short walk from your car, and is the perfect place to enjoy an afternoon picnic or quiet sunset.

Did you know? The High Five reservation got its name when several members of the Forest Society's Land Management staff walked to the top of Wilson Hill and looked out at the expansive view. One of the staff members remarked that he just wanted to give a "high five," and the name stuck.

Trail Information

High Five has one of the best view for effort ratios you'll find in the state! The 1/3 mile hike along a wide woods road to the summit of Wilson Hill is steep but takes less than 15 minutes. From there you can enjoy panoramic views and have a picnic or enjoy the sunset from a boulder or granite bench!

- **DIFFICULTY:** Easy-Moderate (uphill but short)
- ROUND TRIP DISTANCE: 0.7 miles round trip

Getting There/Directions

Access to the property is from the south via Sky Farm Road in Deering. From the town of Hillsborough, take Route 149 East for 1.6 miles and then take a slight right onto Old County Road. Follow this road for 4.2 miles and then turn right onto Sky Farm Road. The property is located on the right after 0.8 miles. Parking is only available along the shoulder of the road. You will see a green gate (do not block) and property sign.

- Dogs must be under owner control at all times, and all dog waste packed out.
