Reservation Details

Monson Center is a 269-acre reservation in Milford and Hollis, New Hampshire, saved from development in 1998 thanks to a grassroots campaign initiated by local residents. This property features the remnants of one of New Hampshire's first inland towns inhabited by Europeans. First settled in 1737, residents farmed the land which spread over 17,000 acres, and lived in the village until 1770 when it was disbanded and absorbed into neighboring towns. The property features original roads, stonewalls and cellar foundations left behind by the former residents. Visitors will enjoy the wooded paths and open fields, along with a beaver pond and heron rookery.

Did you know? It remains unclear today what lead to the abandonment of this settlement, and historians and archeologists continue to study Monson Village with hopes of deciphering the puzzle.

Trail Information

Major trails are former roads in the village of Monson Center (E. Monson Road and W. Monson Road), so they are quite wide. Several loops are possible, along which you will encounter old cellar holes and historical remnants of Monson Center. Many of these features have interpretive signage.

- & DIFFICULTY: Easy
- ROUND TRIP DISTANCE: 2-3 miles
- trail Markings: Yellow rectangles on outer loop (East and West Monson Roads)

Getting There/Directions

Access to Monson Center is on the east side of Federal Hill Road in Milford, NH. There is parking for several cars in front of the gated driveway (Adams Road) and a small lot adjacent. A kiosk is located a few hundred yards down the road into the property, where the forest opens up to fields.
